The results are members of the Catholic Church and their religious order is known as the Society of Jesus. St. Ignatius of Loyola, a soldier turned mystic founded the Jesuit order in 1540, with a group of nine university men. The motto of the order is to work for the greater glory of God.

Today, with a membership of about 16,000, the Jesuits labour all over the world in different spheres of life. Higher education has been their top priority, in over 4000 schools and colleges run by them, spread over five continents. They educate over 20 lakh students. Preparing students to become resourceful and socially responsible citizens has been the prime objective of their educational endeavor.

Our vision is to create a secular, just, and democratic society, especially in the service of the poor, the oppressed, and the marginalized.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The College believes in the Jesuit and constitutional ideals of contributing towards a society of equality, fraternity, and liberty, through an admission policy of 'preferential option for the poor'. It tries to provide quality education to many students from socio-economically marginalized sections of society without compromising academic standards. It aims at developing a critical and rational mind, a concerned heart and a sensitive conscience, a secular spirit with social concern and a commitment to cultural diversity and human values. For the members of the Society of Jesus, education is a mission to build up a group of young men and women, who would work towards a world of peace, equality, and justice.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

The college is autonomous and is affiliated to Bangalore University. Autonomy confers on the college the right to frame its own syllabi and conduct its own internal and semester examinations. The final degree is formally awarded by Bangalore University and carries the name of the college.

STATUTORY COMMITTEES IN THE CAMPUS

To ensure justice and harmony on campus, the college has in place a set of committees. These are also in conformity with UGC requirements. The following are the statutory committees: Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee, Gender Sensitization Cell, Student Grievance and Examination Grievance Redressal Cells.

EXAMINATION AND STUDENT EVALUATION

For each course, there will be both Continuous Assessment (CA) and semester examination(SE), with weightage in the ratio of 30:70. An undergraduate student must secure a minimum of 35% of marks in SE and a minimum of 40% of marks in the aggregate of the two, to pass in each paper. Apart from this requirement, a post graduate student must score minimum of 50% of marks in the aggregate of all papers to pass the semester.

he/she may be allowed to write all papers except the one in which there is shortage. The student will be allowed to write examination in that paper once he/she earns a minimum of 75% attendance in the particular paper by enrolling for that respective paper in the respective semester after completing the course.

CAMPUS AMENITIES

There are excellent PG and UG libraries. Other amenities include: audio-video studios and rooms; seminar halls, an astronomical observatory, an instrumentation centre, auditorium, sports complex, counseling cells, career guidance and placement cell, ATM kiosk, stationery store, video-conferencing facility, health centre, cafeteria and playground.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

a) The application forms may be downloaded from the college website (www.sjc.ac.in). The website contains information about admission process, required documentation and interview dates.
b) Applicants should read the criteria of eligibility under each undergraduate and postgraduate courses that are available on the college website.
c) If the results of II PU/12th std are not announced, applications can be submitted with the marks of 11th std 1st year Pre-University course. Those who apply for B.Com course, should update their marks as and when their final results are declared on the websites of their respective boards. Their selection for interview is based on the marks obtained in the 12th std / II PU marks of final exam.
Those who apply for PG courses, can apply with their previous semester/year marks, if the final exam marks cards are not available.
d) There will be an entrance test for BAVC, B.Voc, EJP and BCA applicants for UG course.
Entrance test dates are announced on the college website and are also displayed on the college notice board. Other undergraduate courses will not have entrance test. Among the PG courses, entrance exam will be conducted for M.A. Journalism and Mass communication, English, Economics and Political Science.
e) The fees for the application form for UG courses is Rs 400/- and for PG courses Rs. 600/-. The fees for UG and PG courses are to be paid by NEFT/Credit/Debit card (please check the website for account details). Those who make the payment by NEFT may have to wait for up to 48 hours for the approval of the UTR before filling the application form.

PAYMENT OF FEES

The college does not collect any capitation fee. If any person, either from within or outside the college asks for a donation for admission, kindly inform the Principal, Vice Principal, or Rector of the college immediately. The case will be handed over to the Police. The fee structure will be posted on the notice board and on the college website. Selected candidates will pay their fees within 24 hours of their admission. If they fail to do so, their admission will be canceled.



CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT

The CA consists of mid-semester test and activities like seminars, assignments, projects, quizzes, and discussions. The CA will be divided as follows:
UG courses: midsemester test (15% - there will be one test of 1-hour duration per paper), activity (10% - students will have to take up one of the activities as prescribed by the respective departments) and attendance (5%).
PG courses: The entire CA activity will be planned and conducted by the respective departments.

SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS (UG & PG)

There are two semesters in an academic year. No student is eligible to write the semester examinations without obtaining a minimum of 75% attendance. If a student has shortage of attendance in more than one paper, he/she will have to apply afresh for the semester in the next following year. However, if a student has shortage of attendance in only one subject,

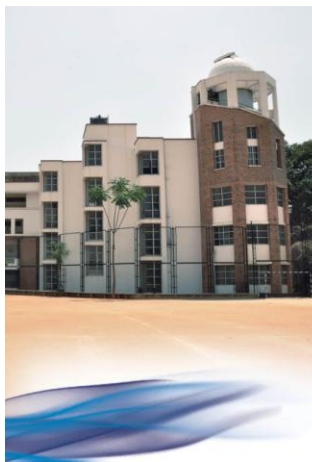
